Quizzing Tip of the Month—The Contest

Rule 3.6 of the Rulebook covers the important topic of Contests in some depth, but it does not tell how to do a good contest. So here are some thoughts on contesting.

The most frequent contest involves the information provided (or not provided) by the quizzer; in other words, the content of the answer is in issue. It is important here to think through whether there is an error that actually matters in light of the question asked. A good approach is to cover three things: (1) identify what the quizzer said, (2) identify what the scripture passage says, and (3) give a reason why the difference between the two matters (or does not matter, if you're defending).

A good contest will also include how you want the quizmaster to rule. The options here are to count the answer correct, call an error, or throw out the question. The last option is available when something in the question itself or how it was asked or other action relating to the question contributes to inaccurate quizzing.

Plan now for Chicago In March, Detroit Bible Quizzing puts together teams of qualified quizzers to compete at the WBQA Chicago Tournament. To qualify, a quizzer must meet two requirements. The first requirement is to have a 20-point average as a veteran or a 10-point average as a rookie. Veteran Jared Elmers and rookies Mike Dempster and Rachel Howell have already scored enough points to guarantee themselves the required average. The second requirement is to have a strong attendance record, meaning that you miss no more than one day of quizzing between October and February. You need to be at the March competition, since that has an extended format of six quizzes rather than the usual three. Plan now, and we'll see you in Chicago.



Little League Quiz Highlights

Heritage then took the lead as rookie **Haley Sargent** scored a freebie and added 20 more on questions 4 and 5. Micah scored again on question 8 to retake the lead. Heritage came right back as **Owen Parker** answered question 9. Rookie **Rachel Howell** put Cornerstone on the board on question 10. Micah froze on 11 to give Fearless its third lead of the quiz, but there were no more Brothers to jump. Owen scored again on 12 to put Heritage back in the lead for good.
