
The opening meeting will start at 12:00 noon. There will be a "quizmaster's choice" raffle drawing to award prizes to the quizzers who were selected.

Tournament Watch. Here are three tournaments this season to know about. The first two are local. The third is the biggy—Chicago.

(1) Great Lakes. Everyone is encouraged to register for this

(2) All Timers. See the flyer on the last page of the newsletter. This tournament is unique—everyone is welcome to quiz, regardless of age or quizzing experience, and it is free.

(3) Chicago. Every year quizzers want to know what it means to have the necessary "average" to qualify for a spot on a DBQ team. So math class is now in session. A 10-point average for rookies to qualify for Chicago does not mean that you qualify with 30 points in October—it is not enough to have a 10-point average for the first 3 quizzes, you need to maintain that for the 21 quizzes in the season. 10 points x 21 quizzes = 210 points total. Oh, look, Quizzer of the Month Cordelia Fike is ¾ and rookie Jack Smith is over ½ of the way there already.

The second requirement to qualify for Chicago is to have a strong attendance record, meaning that you miss no more than one day of quizzing between October and February. You need to be at the March competition—the Day of Champions—since that has an extended format of six quizzes rather than the usual three.

So if you miss one day, you will instead be in 18 quizzes, and for a rookie a 10-point average would then be 180 points.For veterans it is double that.

Plan now, and we'll see you in Chicago.

Promotion. There are many new faces this season, and for each one there is someone to thank for getting them involved in Bible quizzing. Let's keep up the good work of promoting quizzing throughout this season. See what you can do to get family, friends, acquaintances involved now. Get them to one of your practices or to a monthly quiz. Encourage, persuade or drag them (but be nice) into getting involved.

Honorable Mention. Three frozen chairs without error in a day of quizzing equals 210 points. When quizzers get that many points or more and yet don't make Quizzer of the Month, they deserve some recognition. In October, two quizzers attained this distinction:

Rookie Watch. A great part of quizzing is to see which rookies start off strong and which are able to catch on later and make a run for the top spot. Leading the field for the start of this season is **Jack Smith** with 110 points; others with multiple scores are **Victoria Edwards, Rachel George** and **Katie Baugh**; and getting his first score is **Kaleb Caron-Martin**. Make a point to encourage the rookies.

By the way, Jack made quite an impression in his third quiz. Question 2 was a Chapter Verse Reference; Jack jumped on "John 1:33," thought for a moment and quoted 1:34. Question 6 was a FT3V; Jack jumped on "He," quickly quoted John 1:10-13 (*four* verses starting with "He was") and was called wrong because he needed to begin at verse 11 (starting "He came"). On question 10, the score was 0-20-80, but Jack then scored four times for 70 points to claim second place. A remarkable performance, especially for a rookie in his first competition. SPN–70, LP A Dispute–40, \clubsuit 1–80.

Marimont Raise It Up–30, SPN Steal & Kill & Destroy–50, CP Puffy Shyeeep–80

This quiz featured five of this season's seven rookies. CrossPoint rookie **Victoria Edwards** was first to score, followed by St. Paul of Northville rookie **Jack Smith**. Marimont rookie **Katie Baugh**

answered a free question to get her team on the board. SPN took the lead with a score by rookie **Rachel George**, then a fourth team error cost it 10 points. That allowed Marimont to tie for the lead with Katie's 20-pointer. **Destiny Lloyd** scored to put CP back in the lead by 10; Rachel scored to retake the lead for SPN by 10; Victoria got her second score to give CP its *third* lead in the quiz. Now it was question 15 and the score was 30–50–60; all

Now it was question 15 and the score was 30–50–60; all three placings were at stake. Destiny, one of three veteran quizzers in the quiz, got the jump and the answer to seal the win for CP.

Here was another nail-biter quiz seeing lead changes late. **Sophia Fike** got things started for Lake Pointe Wash My Feet, and Heart's **Owen Parker** immediately responded with a score. Sophia got the next two scores to freeze without error. **Curtis Parker** scored to cut Heart's deficit to 30. In on a tossup, Sophia scored again. Owen then got two in a row to pull Heart within 10 points. A free question answered by **Nathan Mayer** put Why does this concern us? on the board. Curtis got his second score, and Heart had its *first* lead of the quiz on question 13. **Caleb Yonker** put Wash My Feet back in front by 10 on question 14. Question 15 was announced as a Memory question, and sure enough it was Curtis getting it for a frozen chair and the come-from-behind win for Heart.

This quiz started with a lot of tough questions: Heart 1's **Sam Hatfield** scored on question 2, but otherwise three errors and an attempt marked the first five questions. **Owen Parker** finally jumped in on question 6 and scored twice more to push Heart 1's lead to 80 points. Then **Curtis Parker** scored, giving Heart 1 a bonus. In on a toss-up, Owen pushed the lead to 130 points. Question 15A served as a tie-breaker for second place and that was taken by Heart 2's **Raine Lily O'Ryan**. The team bonus for Heart 1 proved crucial at the end of the day, giving it a tie for first place in the team standings.

LP Do you want to leave too?-170, CP Puffy Sheep-60, Heart 3-40 This was the high scoring quiz of the day, both for a single team and the three combined. Lake Pointe was coming off a 150-point quiz, and the high-score bonus point earned in each of the two quizzes was key to ending the day tied for first in the team standings. Quizzer of the Month **Cordelia Fike** scored 110 of her points in this quiz, starting with the first two questions. CrossPoint's **Destiny Lloyd** scored before Cordelia got her third to freeze without error. The next three questions were taken one per team: **Carmen Yonker** for LP, Destiny again for CP, and **Kayla Miller** for Heart. After eight questions, 150 points had been scored! Carmen scored again, as did Cordelia on a toss-up, and LP had a 90-point lead with four questions to go. **Noel Alvarez** scored to pull Heart into a tie for second. Cordelia scored again on a toss-up and Carmen completed her frozen chair, so question 15 started with the score 170-40-40. Rookie **Victoria Edwards** got the jump and answer to put CP into second and end the quiz.

LP Why does this concern us?-70, Marimont Raise It Up-20, OCS You Must Decrease-120

Annaliese Sanchez scored three in a row to post Oakland Christians Schools to a 70-point lead. Soraya McKay scored to put Marimont on the board. Matthew Magro pushed the OCS lead back to 70. On question 10, Lake Pointe got its first jump and was on the board with 20 points from Erin Yonker. Annaliese scored again on a toss-up and Matthew got his second, so question 14 started with the score 20–20–130. Following OCS's fourth team error for a deduction, Erin took the last two questions of the quiz to freeze her chair without error and give LP a very solid looking second place.



TIPS AND TRICKS:

Contests (R3.6) and Reviews (R3.9)

When the quizmaster's decision is questionable, what can be done and by whom?

appropriate person(s)

answering quizzer or acting captain contest/rebut request review coach other teammates and audience keep quiet

1. A contest is a request to the quizmaster (1) to change a ruling that a quizzer's answer is either correct or incorrect, (2) to throw out the question, or (3) to correct a rule violation.

Example. On a regular question, the quizzer's answer is not completely accurate. The contest and rebuttal should indicate what the quizzer said, what the scripture says, and why the difference between the two either does or does not matter.

Example. On a regular question, the quizzer pauses and is called incorrect. The quizzer or the quizzer's captain may contest that the quizzer was quoting material just before the answer and could have continued to the answer if allowed the full 30 seconds. Therefore the question should be thrown out.

Example. On a memory question, the quizzer quotes accurately but goes beyond the requested verse and is counted incorrect. The contest would be that the local rule (R 5.2) permits quoting past the verse (the rule is now the same at WBQA-sponsored tournaments like Great Lakes and Chicago).

2. A review is a request by a coach to the quizmaster to correct a rule violation either before or after a quizzer/captain contests.

Example. A guizzer's light was not on and the guizmaster states that he will throw out the guestion. The coach may ask the guizmaster to review his ruling on the basis that all questions asked while the quizzer's light was off must be thrown out (R 6.2.5).

Example. After listening to her recording, the quizmaster rules that she could not hear the quizzer state a necessary word. No rule violation has occurred so a coach cannot request a review to try and convince the quizmaster that the quizzer did say the needed word. [In practice, on rare occasions, coaches have succeeded with a review in this kind of case because even quizmasters can have a bad day.]

Example. Following a contest, the guizmaster throws out a guestion and announces the replacement guestion. The coach may reguest review of the replacement question type (R 3.7.3): a regular question should be replaced with a regular question, a memory question with a memory, and a reference question with the specific CV or CO subtype (see R 5.1.8 – there is exactly one CV and one CO in a packet).


from the M-59 corridor:
